## LOCAL NONPROFIT'S FINANCIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS DELIVERED NATIONALLY

**PORTLAND, Ore., September, 3 2014**—Financial Beginnings, a Portland-based nonprofit that provides financial education programs, is partnering with COUNTRY Financial to bring their programs to the 17 states in which COUNTRY Financial operates.

"We are very excited to partner with COUNTRY Financial who will help spread our financial curriculum across the country."

As part of this partnership, COUNTRY Financial provided funding to Financial Beginnings for the launch of a new program, Pathways. Pathways helps low-income and underserved youth, successfully transition from high school to post-secondary education and beyond, through informed and proactive financial decisions.
